In this topic, we will be looking at how you should manage your photography. By the end of this topic you will know about the importance of organising your work.


#### **Introduction to Software**

We need to look beyond the hardware or folders on your laptop or PC and take a look at some software to deal with the photos that we take. Some of these are free and some are very expensive.





### **The Emergence of Photoshop**



Photoshop is one piece of software that can be used for both photo organisation and editing. Photoshop cannot be used to fix everything – otherwise it is just a manipulated piece of digital art.

Photoshop has become part of our language with the term "photoshopped".




We have a long history of manipulating photos eg. Example: Lincoln head paste

In the fashion and beauty industries, models are often airbrushed to enhance the skin. This manipulation can also be an issue found in photojournalism or war photography.



#### **Folders**

Folders cannot be underestimated. They can be used to easily organise your files but you cannot be bound by the limitations of this tool.




With software, you can tag photos with key words and see information about each file.


IView Media Pro has an interface in which you can see information provided by the photo such as ISO meter and resolution.



Work photography should not be mixed with your personal work for obvious reasons. Use 0-5 stars for rating your photographs.




Keywords are also useful for selling stock photography, should you decide to pursue this route.



Good photo organisation software will tell you specific data such as date of photo, camera model, image size, all of which is important information for each photograph.

Backing up data is very important.

#### **The Ideal Combination**



Nowadays, server space combined with an external hard drive is the common method used by people who work in the digital arts. Keep hard drives safe and do not drop them as they are very sensitive. Dropbox, iCloud, Google Drive and EverNote offer very reasonable prices for online storage.
