Once a garment pattern is cut, a designer will perform the first fitting through a process known as a 'toile'. The toile is a version of the garment made from cheaper fabric. Everything about the toile is similar in weight, texture, and final fabric, only it contains no seams, fastenings, or linings.

Activity 4

Answers

There are three ways that you can cut your pattern along the grain line. These include the straight grain, which cuts pattern pieces parallel to the selvedge and the cross grain, which cuts pattern pieces at a 90-degree angle. Finally, the bias cut cuts patterns at a 45-degree angle on the selvedge and cross grain.
