Adjusting Images

Airbrushing models is a well-known trend in the fashion industry and modelling photography. Also, a lot of people have fun with this online nowadays, testament to the accessibility of media in the digital age.

However, when it comes to Photography itself, a lot of the benefits of Photoshop or good photoshopping skills, come with subtlety. It is these subtle changes that will greatly enhance your work. Quite often, drastic changes can be spotted easily and this is where the term "Photoshopped" emerged. This is an obviously Photoshopped image. This is a manipulated piece of digital art, not photography. We are looking at something that we know is unrealistic to our eyes.
