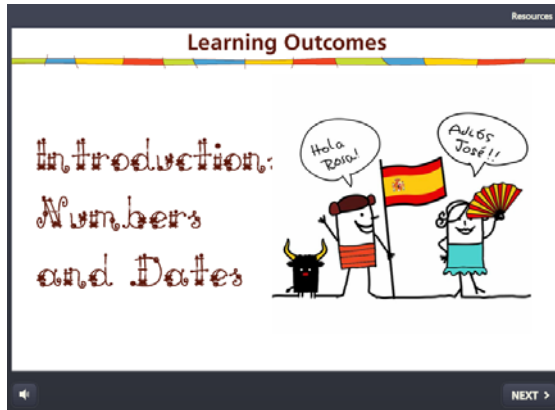

Navigation

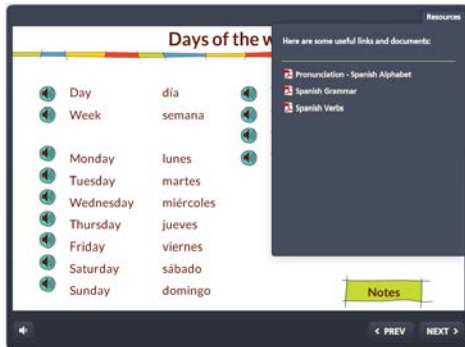

Assessment

Each course has an assessment.

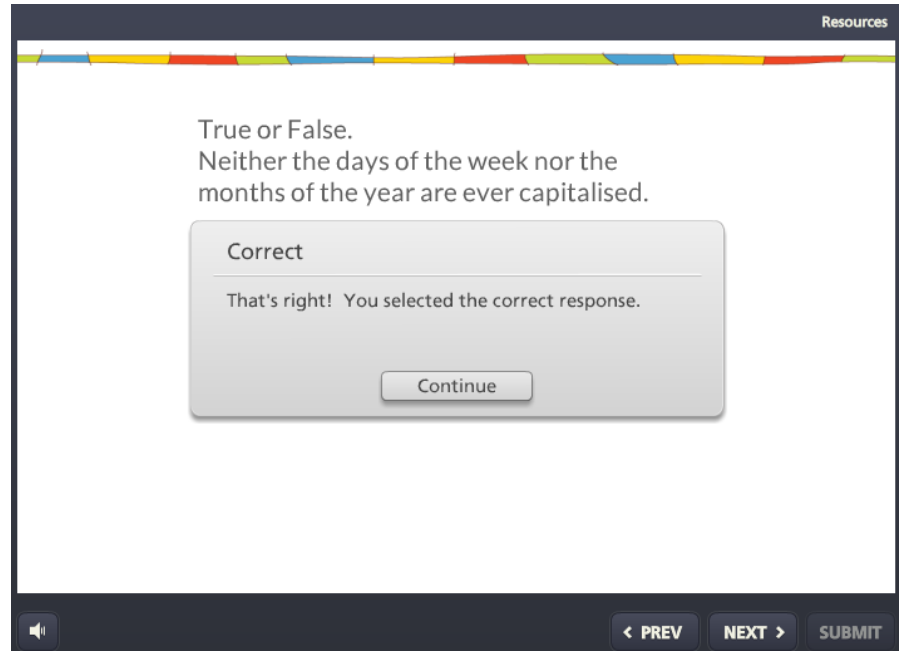
The assessment is generated randomly from a bank of questions.

To pass the assessment the learner must get 80% or over.

Answers are checked on submission and the learner gets a message advising if the answer is correct or not.

On completion of the assessment learners can review the questions and answers to assist learning.

Learners can retake the assessment at a later time.
