When you write your objectives, you should always aim toward the most complex behavior.

Knowledge	Being able to recall applicable knowledge from the memory	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Define• Describe• Identify• Label• List• Name• Recall• Recite• State
Comprehension	Being able to construct meaning from written, oral, and graphic messages	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Convert• Distinguish• Estimate• Explain• Predict• Summarize
Application	Being able to apply previous knowledge to carry out a procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Compute• Demonstrate• Develop• Organize• Solve• Use
Analysis	Being able to identify the relationships among content elements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Diagram• Differentiate• Illustrate• Infer• Outline• Relate
Synthesis	Being able to combine the elements learned in a lesson to produce something completely new	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Categorize• Compose• Create• Formulate• Predict• Produce
Evaluation	Being able to make judgements or suggestions based on specific criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Compare• Contrast
