

Learn English: Superstitions and Continuous Conditionals

Writing Tips

In the revision stage of the writing process, the writer has an opportunity to edit the content of their essay. In this stage, it is essential that the writer reads their essay out loud and asks the following questions:

- Is my essay clear and easy to understand?
- · Have I included enough information for the reader?
- Is there any off-topic information that will confuse the reader?
- Are my ideas presented in a logical manner?
- · Are all of my ideas well supported?

Answering these questions helps the writer find any weaknesses in the arguments presented, reconsider the structure of the essay, elaborate on the evidence presented, or make any clarifications. A good way to do this is to highlight all of the main points of your essay and see how they support your thesis. You can also highlight your main arguments with one color and all your supporting evidence with another.

At this stage, it is a good idea to have someone else read the essay and provide feedback. You might also want to consider the vocabulary used within your essay. Remember, your essay can change multiple times during the revision stage, not just once. That means you will probably do multiple revisions before moving on to the final stage.
