On-line Young Carer Support Workers
2 part-time posts 13 Hrs per week (flexible)

Fixed term contract. Location: flexible - The Trust has offices in London and Glasgow or you can choose to be home-based. Some home-based evening and weekend work required.

Young carers are children and young people who look after a relative with an illness, disability, or substance problem. They need information, advice, fun and a listening ear but most remain unsupported. This project, the UK's first national web resource for young carers is designed to reach isolated and hidden young carers. Our two Young Carer Support Workers will have the skills and experience to engage with individuals and groups of young people, offering support via email, supervised message boards/ chat rooms (training given) and liaising with direct services across the UK.
